

VIRGINIA: At a regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Patrick, held at the Patrick County Veterans' Memorial Building thereof on Monday, March 13, 2006 at 2:00 p.m.

PRESENT: Roger L. Martin, Chairman; David G. Young, Vice Chairman; H. Danny Foley, Sr., Crystal P. Harris, and Jonathan Large, Board Members; Regena H. Handy, County Administrator; Michael Burnette, Assistant County Administrator; Eric Helms Monday, County Attorney; and Mary Beth Roberson, Assistant to the County Administrator.

The Chairman called the meeting to order.

The County Attorney gave the invocation.

The Board recited the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag, followed by a Moment of Silence in honor of U. S. military personnel serving abroad.

On motion by David G. Young, seconded by H. Danny Foley, Sr. and carried, the agenda for the meeting was approved.

On motion by David G. Young, seconded by Crystal P. Harris and carried, the minutes of the February 13, 2006 meeting and work notes of the February 27, 2006 work session were approved.

The Chairman opened the Public Comment Period. The Chairman asked for any comments from the public; none were made and the Public Comment Period was closed.

The County Administrator reported on the activities of her office for the preceding month, as required by Section 15.2-407 (B), 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended.

A. Laurel Fork Cell Site: The County Administrator presented the Board with a letter from Geo-Technology Associates, Inc. regarding notice of Cell Tower Construction for evaluation of historic sites at the proposed Laurel Fork Cell Site in Patrick County, Virginia. She advised that the proposed telecommunications tower would be 250 feet tall and would be located approximately 2,000 feet southeast of the intersection of Highway 58 and Widow Lane in the Laurel Fork area. The County Attorney advised that the firm is required to conduct an independent evaluation for historic sites and the letter is an invitation for the Board to advise of any historic sites in the proposed location. He stated that no action by the Board is required. Mr. Young advised that the proposed site is a good location for a tower. The Chairman stated that the proposed tower would be beneficial to the County. Mr. Foley noted that the Board supports the construction of cell phone towers in the County. The Board took no action on same.

B. Revenue Sharing Program: The County Administrator presented the Board with a letter from the Virginia Department of Transportation regarding the 2007 Revenue Sharing Program. She advised that the County has not participated in this program for the last several years due to a lack of matching funds. She noted that the request for applications deadline has been postponed until after the General Assembly session.

C. Right-of-Way / Surplus Property Request: The County Administrator presented the Board with a Right-of-Way Surplus Property Request from the Virginia Department of Transportation. She advised that the property is located on Route 697 in the Critz area and noted that the requestor is Hopkins, LLC. The Assistant County Administrator advised that he had spoken with Hopkins, LLC and noted that there was a verbal agreement years ago that VDOT would revert the property back to Hopkins, LLC; however, that has not yet taken place. The County Attorney advised that he had been involved in a “private capacity” at the time the verbal agreement had been made; therefore, he could confirm that a verbal agreement had been made between both parties. The Board deferred action on this request until the March work session to be discussed with VDOT Resident Engineer Lisa Price Hughes.

D. Girl Scout Week Proclamation: The County Administrator presented the Board with a proposed Girl Scout Week Proclamation.

On motion by David G. Young, seconded by Crystal P. Harris and carried, the Board does hereby adopt the following:

WHEREAS, Saturday, March 18, 2005, marks the 94th anniversary of Girl Scouts of the USA, founded by Juliette Gordon Low in 1912 in Savannah, Georgia; and,

WHEREAS, throughout its long and distinguished history, Girl Scouting Has inspired millions of girls and women with the highest ideals of character, conduct, and patriotism; and,

WHEREAS, through Girl Scouting girls grow strong, gain self-confidence And leadership skills, and learn the lifelong lesson of contributing to their communities; and,

WHEREAS, Girl Scouting takes an active role in increasing girls' awareness of the opportunities available to them today in math, science, sports, technology and other fields that can expand their horizons; and,

WHEREAS, more than 3.8 million current Girl Scout members nationwide will be celebrating 94 years of this American tradition, with nearly 50 million women who are former Girl Scouts and living proof of the impact of this amazing Movement;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Patrick County Board of Supervisors does hereby applaud the commitment Girl Scouting has made to America's girls and proudly proclaim the week of March 12 –18, 2006 as Girl Scout Week.

E. Budget Update: The County Administrator advised that the School Board's Budget Committee has met twice and would hold a third meeting this Thursday. She noted that the full School Board would discuss the budget on March 27th and has scheduled a public hearing for same on April 13th. She advised that the General Assembly ended its sixty-day session without passing a two-year state budget. Mrs. Handy noted that she had received an email this morning advising that Governor Kaine has called a special session of the General Assembly for March 27th and has urged Legislatures to use the two-week break to arrive at a solution for state funding issues. She presented the Board with several newspaper articles regarding the General Assembly Session and actions from same.

F. Confederate Heritage and History Month: The County Administrator presented the Board with a request from Wharton-Stuart Camp #1832, Sons of Confederate Veterans seeking authorization to fly the 2nd National Flag of the Confederacy over the Stuart Courthouse on April 29, 2006 between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. in celebration of Confederate Heritage and History Month. She

advised that the request includes an invitation to the Board to attend the April Ceremony, which would commence at 1:30 p.m. at the Courthouse and continue at DeHart Park at 3:00 p.m. for a “pig pickin”. Mrs. Harris stated that she would like this request to be tabled until the March work session so that she could give more thought to same. Mr. Young noted that the guest speaker is H.K. Edgerton, a past president for the Asheville, North Carolina Chapter of the NAACP. He stated, “this whole program has nothing to do with race, it has to do with history.” He advised that he would make a motion at the work session to approve the request and noted that he is a great grandson of a Confederate Veteran. The Chairman directed that if the request is approved, the 2nd National Flag of the Confederacy must be flown below the American Flag.

Danny Foley, Sr. and carried, the Board does hereby table the request from Wharton-Stuart Camp #1832, Sons of Confederate Veterans to fly the 2nd National Flag of the Confederacy over the Stuart Courthouse on April 29, 2006 between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. in celebration of Confederate Heritage and History Month.

(2) Building Inspector: A report of the activities of Jason Brown, County Building Inspector, for the preceding month, including a list of the number of new and used mobile homes for which permits were issued during the past month, was presented and examined. Said reports are approved and ordered filed with the papers of this meeting.

(3) DMV Agent: A report of office activities of Shirley Rorrer, Patrick County Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) Agent, was presented for the Board's information. Said report is noted and ordered filed with the papers of this meeting.

(4) **Treasurer:** A trial balance of the records of Carolyn I. Tatum, Patrick County Treasurer, as of the last day of the previous month and a statement of depositories made during the same month was submitted. Said report is noted.

(5) **Animal Control Officer:** A report of the activities of C. Leon Handy, County Animal Control Officer, were presented and examined for the preceding month. Said report is noted and ordered filed with the papers of this meeting.

(6) **Maintenance Supervisor:** A report of activities of Teddy Doss, Maintenance Supervisor was presented and examined for the preceding month. Said report is noted and filed with the papers of this meeting.

(7) **Emergency Management:** A report of the activities of Michael Hudson, Emergency Management Coordinator, was presented and examined for the preceding month. Said report is noted and ordered filed with the papers of this meeting.

(8) **Tourism Director:** A report of the activities of Jeannie Frisco, Tourism Director, was presented and examined for the preceding month. Said report is noted and ordered filed with the papers of this meeting.

(9) **Recreation Director:** A report of the activities of Clyde Crissman, Recreation Director, was presented and examined for the preceding month. Said report is noted and ordered filed with the papers of this meeting.

(10) **Economic Development Director:** A report of the activities of Michael Burnette, Economic Development Director, was presented and examined for the preceding month. Said report is noted and ordered filed with the papers of this meeting.

Mrs. Harris stated that some of the Department Head Reports do not include daily mileage and a monthly total. The County Administrator advised that the March reports would include same. The Chairman stated that some reports need to be more detailed.

H. Proposed GCS Electronics and Communications Memorandum of Understanding: The County Administrator presented the Board with a proposed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the County and GCS Electronics and Communications in regards to a reasonable, expedient response to radio

communication issues on a 24/7 time frame. She noted that the Board had discussed the proposed MOU during the February work session and the Board directed that it be sent to the E-911 Committee for its review. She advised that the Committee met last Wednesday and approved the MOU.

On motion by Crystal P. Harris, seconded by David G. Young and carried, the Board does hereby approve the Memorandum of Understanding between the County and GCS Electronics and Communications relating the County's radio communication equipment, frequencies, and any other devices utilized for the E-911 Center, Bull Mountain Site, Ararat Site, and the Meadows of Dan Site.

I. Ararat River Dam Inspection: The County Administrator presented the Board with a Request for Proposals for Professional Architectural / Engineering Services relating to the renewal of Class III Six-year Regular Operation and Maintenance Certificates from the Virginia Department of Conservation and Recreation for Ararat River Dam #17 and #32. Mrs. Handy noted that the Board had previously discussed this issue. She advised that the Assistant County Administrator had created the RFP, which had been advertised and mailed to several firms. She noted that five RFPs were received and that she and Mr. Burnette had reviewed the documents last Friday. Mrs. Handy requested authorization that she and Mr. Burnette further review the RFPs, and choose three firms to be interviewed, and to bring their recommendation back to the Board. Mr. Burnette noted that the last inspection was conducted six years ago at a cost of approximately \$2,000 per inspection.

On motion by Jonathan Large, seconded by Crystal P. Harris and carried, the Board does hereby authorize the County Administrator and the Assistant County Administrator to further review the Request for Proposals for Professional Architectural / Engineering Services relating to the renewal of Class III Six-year Regular Operation and Maintenance Certificates from the Virginia Department of Conservation and Recreation for Ararat River Dam #17 and #32, select three firms to be interviewed, and bring a recommendation to the full Board

J. Patrick County Public Schools Revised Budget Request: The County Administrator presented the Board with a revised budget request from the Patrick County School Board. She stated that the request advises of additional funding from a 21st Century Grant for Stuart Elementary in the amount of \$79,960 and Workforce Investment funds for operation of the One-Stop Satellite Center totaling \$44,311.20.

On motion by David G. Young, seconded by H. Danny Foley, Sr. and carried, the Board does hereby approve additional state and federal funds in the amount of \$124,271.20 be added to the 2005-2006 Patrick County School Budget, increasing the total school budget to \$23,163,437.36.

The Assistant County Administrator gave a report on matters relating to his office.

A. Patrick County Recreation Park Grant: The Assistant County Administrator presented the Board with draft copies of an Application for Patrick County Recreation Park Grant and a Patrick County Recreation Park Grant Reimbursement Request. He noted that the grants would be funded by proceeds from the sale of property in the Patrick County Business Park. Mr. Large presented the Board with a request from the Dan River Park Association in regards to monies for the completion of the park's concession/press building. He advised that Josh Cockerham had created a sign that would be installed at the park, which was an Eagle Scout project. Mrs. Harris advised that the request "looks good"; however, she preferred that the Board defer action on this request until final copies of the Application for Patrick County Recreation Park Grant and Patrick County Recreation Park Grant Reimbursement Request are approved at the work session. Mr. Large stated that many volunteers are responsible for the progress of the Dan River Park. Mr. Young noted that the Patrick Springs Park is also in the process of undergoing renovations.

B. Strategic Planning Retreat: The Assistant County Administrator reminded the Board of the upcoming Strategic Planning Retreat, which has been scheduled for March 31st and April 1st and will be held in the boardroom in the Patrick County Veterans' Memorial Building.

The County Attorney stated that he did not have any items to discuss in open session.

This day came Orlando Martin regarding the proposed Mayo River Park. Mr. Martin thanked the Board for its efforts in creating the proposed park and offered his services regarding same. Mr. Foley advised that he is in the process of recruiting citizens to serve on the proposed park's board of directors.

Young. and carried, the Board convened into Executive Session to discuss legal matters [Section 2.2-3711(A)(7), 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended]; prospective business matters [Section 2.2-3711(A)(5), 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended]; personnel matters [Section 2.2-3711(A)(1), 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended]; real property [Section 2.2-3711(A)(3), 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended]; and annexation issues [Section 15.2-2907 (D), 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended].

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Patrick County Board of Supervisors does hereby certify that, to the best of each member's knowledge, only such public business matters as were identified in the motion convening the executive meeting were heard, discussed or considered by the Board,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Patrick County Board of Supervisors does hereby certify that, to the best of each member's knowledge, only public business matters lawfully exempted from open meeting requirements by Virginia law were discussed in the executive meeting to which this certification resolution applies.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Patrick County is committed to the successful and efficient operation of the County's parks and encourages the pursuit and development of recreational activities, including organized athletic competition, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors has previously abolished the Patrick County Parks Commission and desires to replace it with an entity, which can more effectively serve the need of the County's citizens,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Patrick County Parks and Recreation Committee is hereby created:

1. The Committee shall consist of five persons, one residing in each magisterial district of the County, appointed by the Supervisor representing that magisterial district.
2. The terms shall be four years; the initial members shall be appointed to staggered terms of one, two and three years, with two members having four year terms. The length of these initial terms shall be drawn at random after appointment.
3. The Patrick County School Board shall appoint one additional member to a term of four years; this member shall serve ex officio. Also, Stuart Town Council shall appoint a member to serve ex officio.
4. The Board of Supervisors shall appoint one additional member to a term of four years; this member shall serve as ex officio.
5. No person shall be appointed to more than two consecutive terms.
6. The County Recreational Director shall not be a member of the Committee, and shall provide staff support to the Committee.
7. The Committee is charged with the formation of general policies to foster the development of the Parks System in Patrick County and is further charged with undertaking the scheduling and supervision of organized team recreational athletics in the County.
8. The committee's decisions may be overridden by the Board of Supervisors, and with respect to the policies affecting individual parks, by that park's Board of Directors.

9. The Committee shall adopt its own bylaws, subject to the approval of the Board of Supervisors, which shall not be amended without the consent of the Board of Supervisors.
10. The Committee shall meet at least once every quarter.
