The following ordinance proposed at a regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors held at the Courthouse thereof, on Monday, March 12, 1984, having been duly advertised for adoption as provided by law, after a hearing held on Monday, April 9, 1984, on motion by Roscoe F. Epperson, seconded by J. Cornelius Stovall and carried, is hereby adopted:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, PATRICK COUNTY, VIRGINIA, TO PROHIBIT HUNTING NEAR PRIMARY AND SECONDARY HIGHWAYS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PATRICK COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, PATRICK COUNTY, VIRGINIA, at its regular meeting held on the 9th day of April, 1984, and after due advertisement of same: It shall be unlawful in the County of Patrick to hunt or attempt to hunt with a firearm, any game bird or game animal while the hunting or attempting to hunt is on or within twenty-five (25) feet of any primary or secondary highway in said County.

Any person convicted of violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished in accordance with Section 29-161 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended.

This Ordinance shall become effective in the County of Patrick, at 12:01 a.m. on May 1, 1984.
