

Supervisors Order Book No. 6, p. 156  
(Adopted March 20, 1934)

RESOLVED THAT any person, firm or corporation, having any where in the County of Patrick, a slot machine of any description, into which are dropped pennies or coins of larger denominations to dispose of chewing gum or other articles of merchandise or for the purpose of operating musical or other devices that operate on the metal in the slot principal, used for gain, shall pay for every such slot machine or musical or other device, as the case may be, a county license tax of \$100.00 per year, provided, however, that nothing contained in this section shall be construed as permitting any such person, firm or corporation to keep, maintain, exhibit or operate any slot machine or other device, in the operation of which the elements of chance enters.

Any person, firm or corporation having any such machine or other device and failing to procure a county license therefor, shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$20.00 for each offence.

This section shall be in force on and after April 15, 1934.

(Adopted April 16, 1934)

Resolved that any person, firm or corporation, having any where in the County of Patrick, a slot machine of any description, into which are dropped pennies or coins of larger denominations to dispose of chewing gum or other articles of merchandise or for the purpose of operating musical or other devices that operate on the "nickle-in-the-slot" principal, used for gain, shall pay for every such slot machine or musical or other device, as the case may be, a county license tax of \$500.00 per year for the first machine installed or operated and \$2.00 additional on each penny machine and \$10.00 on each additional machine using five cents or larger coins, provided, however, that nothing contained in this order shall be construed or permitting any such person, firm or corporation to keep, maintain, exhibit or operate any slot machine, or other device, in the operation of which the elements of chance enters.

Any person, firm or corporation having any such machine or other device and failing to procure a county license therefor, shall be fined not less than \$20.00 for each day said machine or machines are operated in his, hers or its place of business.

This Section shall be in force on and after April 18th 1934. And the order as entered on March 20, 1934, as to the operation of slot machines etc., be and the same is hereby rescinded.
