

SUPERVISORS ORDER BOOK NO. 13, PAGE
(Adopted June 9, 1986)

The following ordinance proposed at a regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Patrick County, held at the Courthouse thereof, on Monday, May 12, 1986, and after have been duly advertised for adoption as provided by law, after a hearing this day at 2:00 p.m., at which no one appeared to comment verbally or present written statements thereon, on motion by Lowell A. Layman, seconded by Ewell Harold and carried, is hereby adopted.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of Patrick County, Virginia, as follows:

Parking and Spaces Reserved for Handicapped Persons; Issuance of Summons by Police Officers and Other Uniformed Personnel.

(a) It shall be unlawful in the County of Patrick, Virginia, including the Town of Stuart, Virginia, for a vehicle not displaying a license plate, decal or special parking permit issued pursuant to Section 46.1-104.1, 46.1-149.1 or 46.1-254.2 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended, to be parked in a parking space reserved for the handicapped on public property or at privately owned parking areas.

(b) Violation of this section shall be punished as a Class IV misdemeanor.

(c) A summons for any such offense may be issued by police officers and other uniformed personnel employed by the County of Patrick or the Town of Stuart to enforce parking regulations without the necessity of a warrant being obtained by the owner of such private parking area.

(d) Spaces reserved for the handicapped shall be identified by above-grade signs.

This Ordinance shall be effective upon its adoption on June 9, 1986.
