

The following ordinance proposed at the regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Patrick County held at the Patrick County Administration Building, on the 8th day of June, 1987, having been duly advertised for adoption as provided by law, after a hearing thereon, on motion by Lowell A. Layman, seconded by Ewell Harold and carried, the following ordinance is hereby adopted.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Patrick County Board of Supervisors, after notice and publication pursuant to §15.1-504 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended, at their duly called meeting on this 8th day of June, 1987, that:

WHEREAS, the members of the Patrick County Sheriff's Department and other law enforcement officers in Patrick County, from time-to-time engage in off-duty employment which may require the use of their police powers in the performance of such employment; and

WHEREAS, such employment of off-duty law enforcement officers provides a benefit to the organizations which they serve and the county as a whole; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Board of Supervisors of Patrick County that such law enforcement officers have, to the extent permitted by law, insurance coverage to protect them from any liability for personal injury, bodily injury, or property damages resulting from such off-duty activities.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to §15.1-133.1 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended, the Sheriff and members of the Patrick County Sheriff's Department, and all other law enforcement officers and deputy sheriffs in Patrick County shall be and are hereby permitted to engage in off-duty employment which may occasionally require the use of their police powers in the performance of such employment. It is further ORDAINED that the Sheriff of Patrick County is hereby delegated the responsibility of promulgating such reasonable rules and regulations to apply to such off-duty employment of such officers.
