ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE OPERATION OF A MOTOR BOAT ON ANY STREAM OF WATER, LAKE, OR DAM RESERVOIR IN PATRICK COUNTY WHILE UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVER-AGES OR SELF ADMINISTERED DRUGS AND TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF SAID ORDINANCE.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Patrick County having authority under the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia, and more especially under provisions of Section 15-8 (5) of the Code of Virginia, to adopt such measures as they may deem expedient to secure and promote the health, safety and general welfare of the inhabitants of this County; and, Whereas,

The Board deems it necessary in order to better secure and promote the health, safety and general welfare of the inhabitants of Patrick County that this ordinance be adopted;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of Patrick County as follows:

No person shall drive or operate any motorboat, or other power driven boat on any stream or waterways, dam reservoirs, lakes or any stream of water while under the influence of alcoholic beverage, or self administered narcotic drugs or intoxicant. Any person found guilty of the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$100.00 and not more than \$500.00, or by confinement in jail for a period not exceeding six months, or by both such fine and confinement.

Any person who shall be convicted of a second offense of the provisions of this ordinance within a twelve months period from date of the first conviction shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$100.00 or more than \$1,000.00, and by confinement in jail for not less than thirty days nor more than twelve months.

Be it further ordained that this ordinance be, and the same is to be effective on and after the 10th day of August, 1953.
