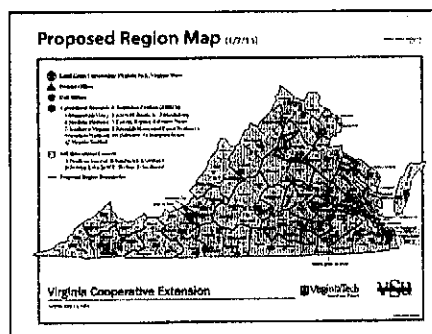
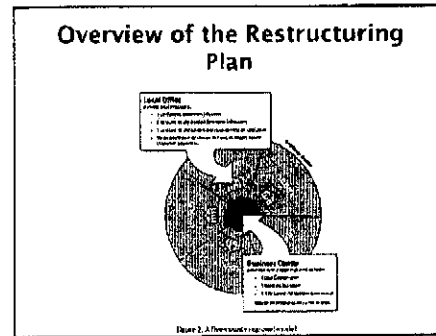
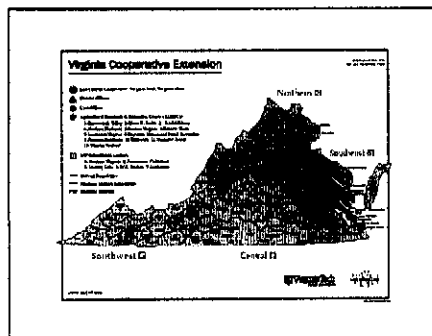
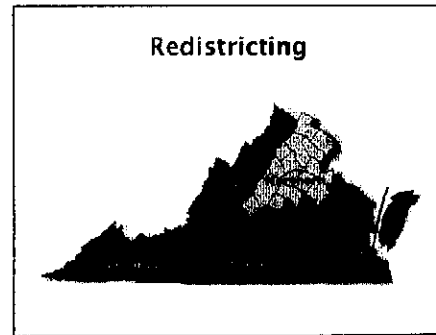
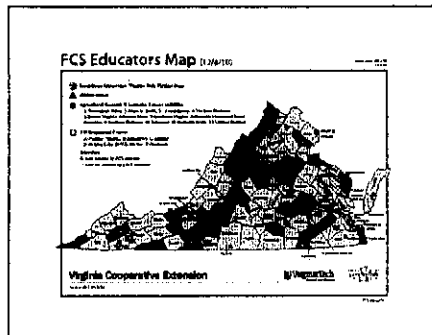
**Motivation**

- ☐ In the 2010 budget bill, state funding reductions eliminated \$5.5 million for VCE and the Virginia Agricultural Experiment Station.
- ☐ Included a \$1 million reduction targeted specifically at restructuring VCE.
- ☐ FY 2008 through FY 2012, the VCE budget has been reduced by \$10.3 million (15.9%).

**Legislative Mandates**

- ☐ Place priority on the historic mission of Extension to fulfill the land-grant mission in partnership with the USDA.
- ☐ Define programming, locations, and funding sources.
- ☐ Address potential duplication of effort with other agencies.
- ☐ Eliminate low-priority programs.
- ☐ Seek to restructure and consolidate local offices in a manner that is financially and logistically beneficial while preserving critical programs in high priority areas.





### Updates

- The Virginia Association of Counties (VACO) has chartered a committee to work with Extension administration to develop and implement a structure for County Administrators to participate in further planning.
- The original goal for implementation was October 2011. However, the transition to a new structure will not begin until June 2011 and may not be completed until June 2012.
- The original proposal was to have one administrative assistant per business center. It is now recognized that two may be more realistic.

### Updates continued...

- ▣ The business center options are currently recognized as either:
  - a single physical space co-located with a county or city Extension office
  - a second option would be to have a "virtual" business center
- ▣ Discussions with the 4-H educational center administration have stressed the importance of minimizing disruption during the summer 2011. As a result of this input, any reassignments that may impact 4-H agents and staff will occur after the close of the 2011 summer camping season.
- ▣ We will work with localities to develop new budgets for fiscal year 2013.

### Current Office Staff

- ▣ The current office make-up is:
  - Three extension agents serving ANR, FCS, and 4-H. All three agents are co-funded by the state (66.7%) and county (33.3%).
  - Unit administrative assistant (100% state-funded)
  - 4-H Technician (100% county funded)
  - Family Nutrition Program PA (100% federal funding)

### Scenarios

- ▣ There are many....
  - State/county co-funded position in each local office.
  - 100% county funded positions.
  - Two or more counties sharing an educator.
  - Educators assigned to business centers (on paper) but located in county offices.

**Solid Waste Permit #70**

**Landfill Ground Water**

**Current Status:**

1. Corrective Action for Vinyl Chloride- Current monitoring indicates decreasing trend in concentrations. Estimated 3-6 years to compliance. Must be in compliance for 3 consecutive years to end Corrective Action and terminate Post Closure Care.
2. 1,2-Dichloropropane, chloroethane, and Tetrachloroethene were removed in January 2010 from Corrective Action Permit because analytes no longer exceeds groundwater standards.
3. In January 2009 Groundwater Standard for Cobalt from 156.5 ppb to 4.696 ppb. Cobalt is above this revised standard but below previous standards. Request to add to cobalt to the facility Corrective Action Plan is pending. Current monitoring indicates decreasing trend in concentrations.

**Landfill Gas**

**Current Status:**

1. Landfill Gas Monitoring indicates the facility is in compliance with solid waste regulations. (Less than 4% methane)
2. Monitoring of subsurface conditions in monitoring probes performed on a quarterly basis.
3. Gas Extraction System Installed in northern most portion of the waste cell to prevent landfill gases from migrating off-site at northern property boundary. Gas is vented to the atmosphere at height.,
4. LGW-10 was installed to replace LGW-3 due to high levels of methane in LGW-3. County can request to use LGW-3 in lieu of LGW-10. Recent monitoring in LGW-3 indicates the probe is in compliance with solid waste management regulations
5. May be able to use historical groundwater data, historical monitoring data from LGW-10 to demonstrate that stream between transfer station and shooting range is a barrier to subsurface gas migration.

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## PATRICK COUNTY LANDFILL ENVIRONMENTAL PROGRAMS

### More Detailed Information Regarding Monitoring Requirements:

#### Groundwater:

- Sampling and Analysis:
  - Semi-annual monitoring required.
  - Compliance Wells, Performance Wells, Sentinel Wells—Network for Corrective Action Monitored Natural Attenuation (MNA) to address Groundwater Protection Standard (GWPS) exceedances (Vinyl Chloride and requested to add cobalt).
  - Surface Water Monitoring at three locations in the South Mayo River for Constituents of Concern (COC) on a semiannual basis.
- Reporting:
  - Semi-Annual Reporting Required
  - Annual Report Required by March 1 each year or within 44 days of receipt of laboratory analysis (Jan 15)
  - CASE Report every 3 years (2009, 2012, 2015, etc)
- Cobalt Detections
  - Standard was lowered in January 2009 to 4.7 ug/L (ppb)
  - Site Specific ACL was requested in November 2009 (requested to use subchronic reference dose based on site specific conditions)
  - Request was denied by DEQ on May 24, 2010.
  - Requested background based standard of 11 ug/L (ppg) in September 2010
  - Requested that cobalt be added as COC and updated documentation (September 2010)

#### Landfill Gas

- Gas wells and Building monitored at minimum quarterly

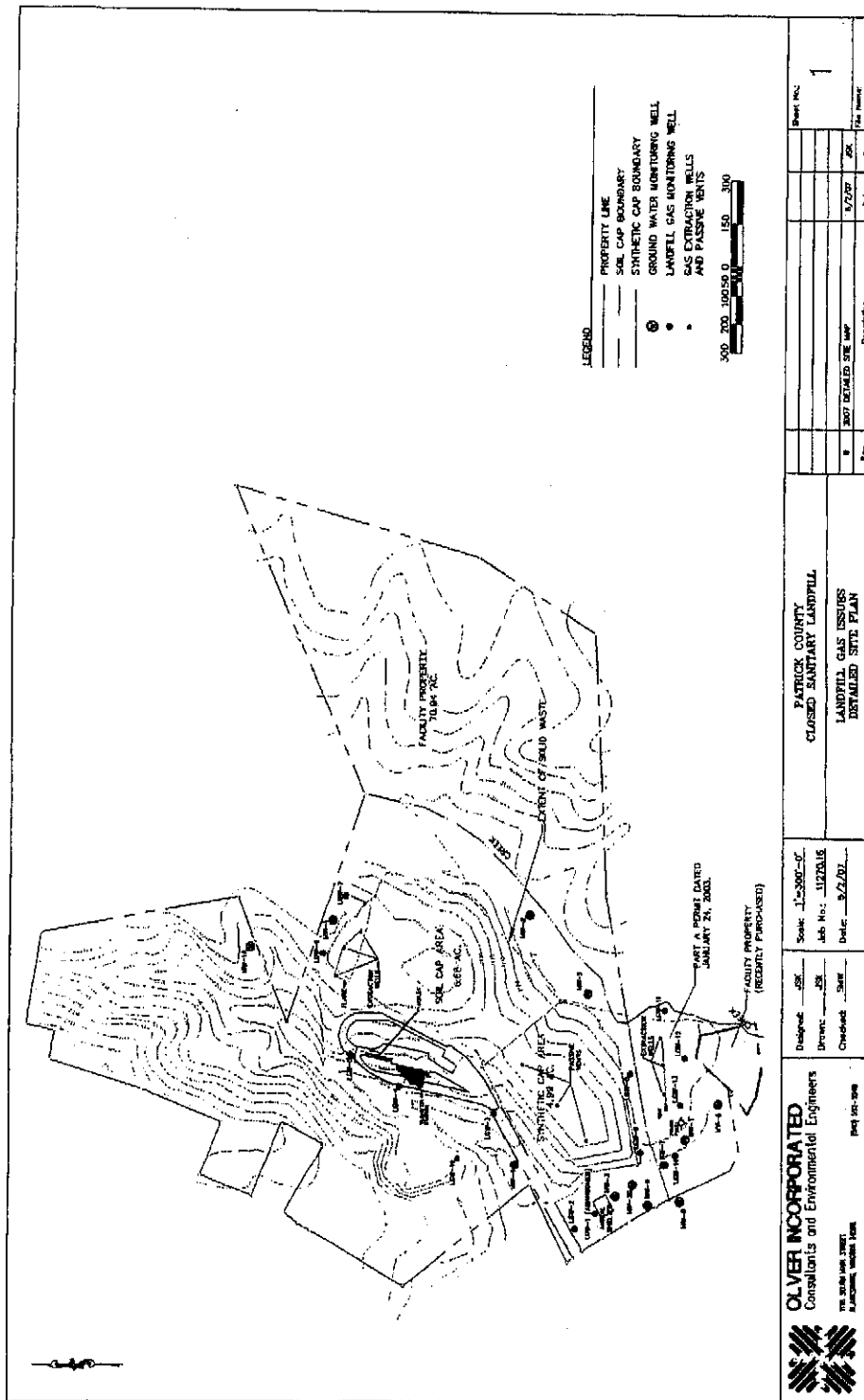
#### Storm Water – Transfer Station/Closed Landfill

- General Statewide Permit – New Permit in July 2009
- Storm Water Prevention Pollution Team-Need to Update Personnel
- Annual Training provided by Olver December 2010
- Quarterly Facility Inspections
- Quarterly Storm Water Visual Inspections
- Annual Comprehensive Site Inspection-December 2010
- Annual Storm Water Effluent Analysis Monitoring- Need to get a sample in 2011.

**WHEREAS**, Section 33.1-70.1 of the *Code of Virginia*, permits the improvement and hard surfacing of certain unpaved roads deemed to qualify for designation as a **Rural Rustic Road**; and

**WHEREAS**, any such road must be located in a low-density development area and have no more than 1500 vpd; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Supervisors of Patrick County, Virginia ("Board") requests that (*show State Route number and street name*) Route 757 (Trent Store Lane), From: Route 832 (Golf Course Road) To: Dead End be designated a Rural Rustic Road; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board is unaware of pending development that will significantly affect the existing traffic on this road; and

**WHEREAS**, this road is in the Board's six-year plan for improvements to the secondary system of state highways; and

**WHEREAS**, the general public and particularly those citizens who own land abutting this road have been made aware that this road may be paved with minimal improvements as is consistent with the development of a rural rustic road project; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board believes that this road should be so designated due to its qualifying characteristics;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, the Board hereby designates this road a Rural Rustic Road, and requests that the Residency Administrator for the Virginia Department of Transportation concur in this designation.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, the Board requests that this road be hard surfaced and, to the fullest extent prudent, be improved within the existing right of way and ditch-lines to preserve as much as possible the adjacent trees, vegetation, side slopes, and rural rustic character along the road in their current state.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that a certified copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Residency Administrator for the Virginia Department of Transportation.
